In preparation for this week's group discussion, **read Genesis 15:1-11**. Please answer the questions in advance to enable a lively group discussion.



Challenge: Explain how you will apply this lesson to your life. How will you improve on hearing the voice of God, accepting His rewards, and moving forward in faith?




BTW SESSION 2: THE LOVE TRIANGLE
