Lesson 4: Create New Disciples

Scripture Reference: Matthew 28:19-20

<u>OBJECTIVE</u>: To build a relationship with a person helping them grow in and accept Christ to become a disciple of Jesus

Understanding the Discipling Terms

1. A Disciple

A **disciple** is someone who is following Jesus Christ (head), being changed by Jesus through the Holy Spirit (heart) and committing to the mission of our Savior Jesus Christ (hand).

2. Discipleship

Discipleship is the <u>intentional training</u> of people who voluntarily submit to the Lordship of Christ and who want to become imitators of Him in every thought, word, and deed. (Barna, 2001)

3. Disciple-making

Disciple-making involves entering into relationships to help people trust and follow Jesus (Matt. 28:18–20), which includes the whole process from conversion through maturation and multiplication.

I. A Look at the Great Commission

Scripture Reference: Matthew 28:19-20

The essence of Jesus' Great Commission statement is to make disciples of all nations (vs. 19). The question becomes how do we do that? What does it look like if disciples make a disciple? How do we begin this process?

Three practical steps:

1. Go: Disciples cannot be passive about making disciples. The command of Jesus is to go to our family members, friends, into our communities, into our organizations, and into the world and proclaim the gospel.

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2. **Baptize:** Baptism is a public profession and declaration of our faith in Jesus Christ. Baptism helps us to stay focused on our mission. The mission is not to stop people from

sinning or even to get them to attend church. Our mission is simply to develop a relationship with people so that we may share the gospel.

3. **Teach:** Just because a person accepts Jesus as their Lord and Savior that does not mean the job is complete. The next step is to teach them to observe everything that Jesus commanded. In other words, we have to teach new disciples what it means to live as a disciple of Christ.

The process of disciple-making is a journey. It requires patience with people as you serve them and as you begin ministering to them.
