LESSON 3 The Church Making Salvation Known

Scripture Reference **ACTS 10**

Objective

For Church Members to explain salvation, to persons who are unsaved when the situation presents itself.

Introduction

Questions:

- 1. When was the last time you explained salvation to someone?
- 2. When was the last time you lead someone to Christ?

PRAYER: Lord we ask right now in your name that would give us opportunities to explain and lead someone to You, in Jesus' name.

Case Scenario

Acts 10 is about the gospel being advanced to the Gentiles.

Review Acts 1:8

This chapter explains how the Gentiles received salvation:

- a. Acts 2 The door of salvation had been opened to the Jews.
- b. Acts 8 The door of salvation had been opened to the Samaritans.
- c. Acts 10 Now the gospel is being brought to the Gentiles.

Remember the Great Commission (Mt. 28:19-20) instructed disciples of Jesus to go and teach.

SCENARIO: Imagination you have been invited to someone's backyard cookout to speak about Jesus, what would you say, how would you approach the moment?

Let's Prepare

Background Acts 10 – The Apostle Peter has been invited to share the Gospel

Acts 10:1 -2 Cornelius, a man who lived in Caesarea, who feared God and

- **Acts 10:2** He helped meet the needs of Jewish people.
- Acts 10:2 He prayed to God continually.
- Acts 10:22 Cornelius was a righteous man, but he was not saved.

Acts 10:3-4 – Received a vision from God to send for Peter.

- Why Peter and not another servant of Jesus? Jesus gave Peter the keys to the Kingdom, to bound and loose, in Matthew 16:19
- Acts 10:14 The Lord had to prepare Peter for this assignment. God used food to help Peter understand that the Gentiles were not unclean.

Acts 10:20 – The Spirit prompted Peter to go with the men whom Cornelius had sent.

QUESTION: What is the difference between Cornelius and religious people today?

Acts 10:23-24 – Cornelius called together his relatives and close friends to hear the gospel

Remember, Salvation is the divine work of grace to bring men to a place to accept Jesus' death on the cross.

It is a privilege to share the gospel with someone who does not know the truth of Jesus.

Practical

Application

Let's walk through Peter's opportunity to share the gospel:

Read Romans 10:13 & 17 - A person does not come to faith in Jesus without the Word.

Read Acts 10:34-44 and note Peter's explanation of salvation.

- 1. **Acts 10:29** When given an opportunity, ask people what is that they want to know and or allow people to explain to you their concerns about Jesus, Salvation, Christianity. Just as Philip did with the Ethiopian Acts 8: 30.
- 2. **Vs. 34 -35** What does Peter mean, "God is not one to show partiality." If you were sharing the gospel, how would you explain this point:

Scripture References: Romans 2:11, Romans 3:22-23; Romans 10:1-13;
Acts 4:10

3. Vs. 36 -37 – What does Peter mean, Jesus: "He is Lord of all." **Scripture Reference:** Acts 2:36, Romans 10:12

How would you explain, Jesus is Lord over all:

- 4. Vs. 38 Peter explains aspects of Jesus:
 - a. Jesus of Nazareth Acts 2:22
 - b. How God anointed Him with the Holy Spirit Acts 4:26
 - c. Went about doing good and healing Mt. 4:23
 - d. God was with Him John 3:2
