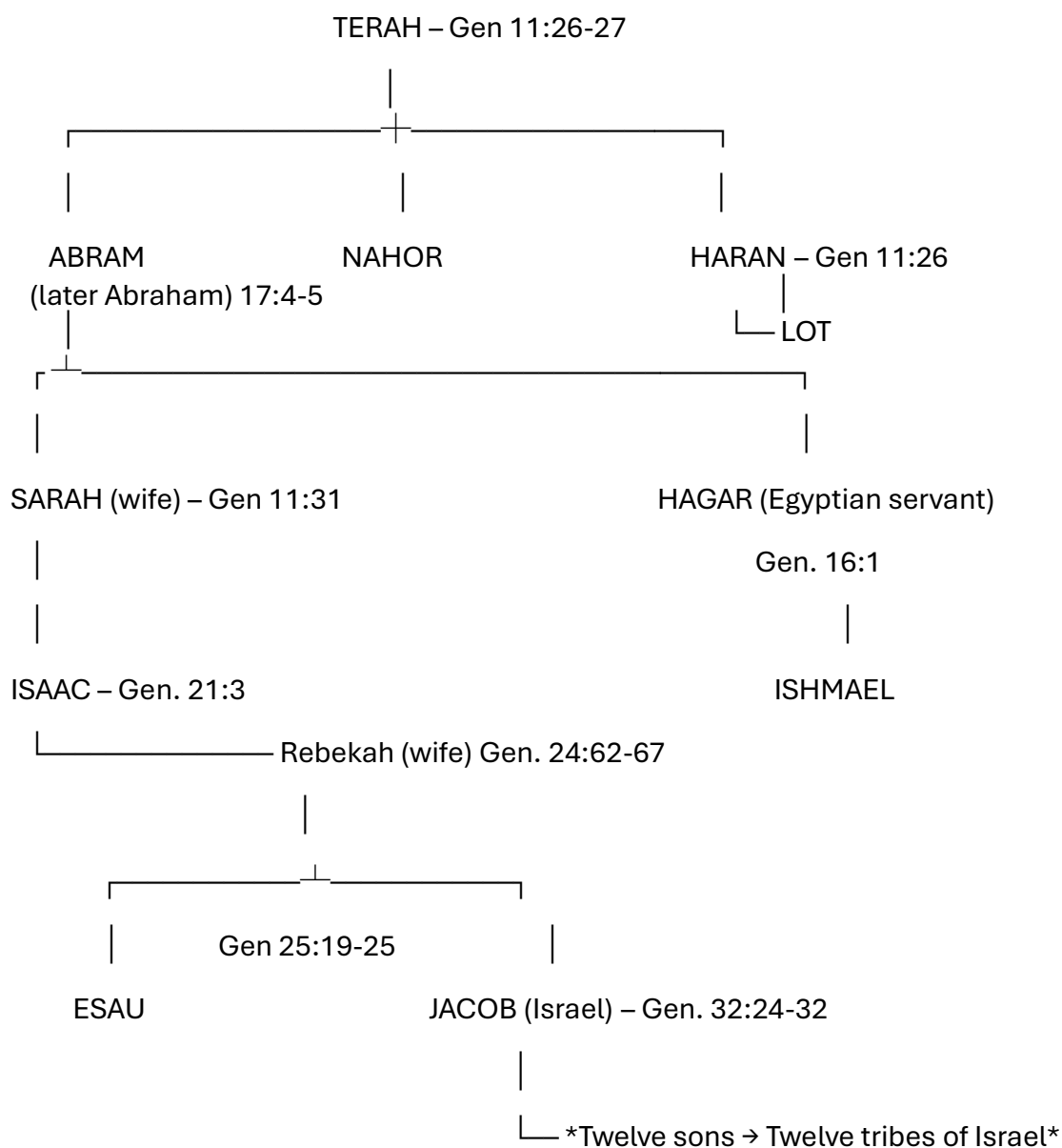


LESSON Genesis 27: DECEPTION

The blessing Issac bestowed on Jacob entailed declaring Jacob’s future and it aligned with the promise God gave to Abraham (12:1-6). The blessing invokes God’s favor.

The blessing to Jacob:

1. Affirmed God’s showering of blessings – the dew of heaven
2. Abundance of Provision – abundance of grain and wine
3. Shapes the future and grants authority – people will serve
4. Family Responsibility – may your mother’s sons bow down to you
